Central News

1. GDP growth of 13.5%

- ❖ The country's gross domestic product (GDP) grew by 13.5% in the first quarter of the current financial year from April to June.
- ❖ The National Statistics Office (NSO) reported that the GDP in the first quarter of this year was 13.5% higher than the rate recorded in the last three quarters of the last financial year 2021-22.
- ❖ 2023 economic growth of the country will increase to **7 to 7.5 percent.**

2. Smart Boxer

- ❖ IIT Chennai researchers in collaboration with Inspire Institute of Sports (IIS) are developing advanced boxing analytics software to boost India's medal haul at the 2024 Olympics.
- ❖ IIT Chennai's Center of Excellence for Sports Science and Analytics is developing analytics software called 'Smart Boxer'.
- This analytics platform will provide feedback and performance assessments through 'Internet-of-Things-Thinks' using wearable sensors and video cameras.

How does it work?

➤ Based on the Internet of Things, gloves with sensors to analyze punch-in speed, barometers with wireless foot insoles to record ground reaction forces, wireless EMG sensors to record athletes' lower body movement, kinetic energy A unit of measurement is also used.

3. G-20 countries

- Union Environment Minister Bhupender Yadav said that India is committed to solving the problem of climate change.
- The G-20 Environment and Climate Change Ministers meeting has started in Bali, Indonesia.
- Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, China, France, Germany, India, Indonesia, Italy, Japan, South Korea, Mexico, Russia, Saudi Arabia, South Africa, Turkey, Britain, United States, European Union are included in the assembly system.

4. Five percent increase in cyber crimes

- Cyber crime in India has increased by 5 percent in the last year (2021).
- ❖ It is significant that it has increased by 15 percent in the previous year.
- ❖ Telangana, Uttar Pradesh, Karnataka, Maharashtra and Assam reported the highest number of cyber crimes in 2021.
- ❖ 60.8% of cybercrimes involve fraud and fraudulent activities including financial.
- This is followed by 8.6 percent of sexual cybercrimes.



- ❖ 5.4 percent are crimes of intimidation and threats.
- Telangana reported the highest number of cybercrimes at 10,303.
- Crimes against women and children are also taking place on the internet.
- ❖ Information theft, debit and credit card frauds are common on the internet.

5. Domestic vaccination against cervical cancer

- First indigenously developed vaccine for cervical cancer to be introduced.
- Serum India has produced Cervavec vaccine which provides immunity against cervical cancer.
- t is active against human papillomavirus, the main cause of cervical cancer.

6. Video School in Delhi

- ❖ Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal launched a virtual school (Virtual School-TMVS) for classes nine to 12 students from any part of the country to study together.
- Enrollment for schooling of students between 13 to 18 years across the country will be initiated through this video school.
- ❖ Students will be given skill based coaching along with coaching for entrance exams like **NEET**, **CUET** and **JEE** by experts.
- The establishment of this video school, the first of its kind in the country, will prove to be a milestone in the field of education.

7. Magsaysay Award

Psychiatrist Sothiara Sim, who helped victims of government repression in Cambodia, and Bernadette Matric, a Filipino doctor who helped thousands of abused children, have been selected for the Philippine Magesai Award, known as the Nobel Prize of Asia.

8. Death of Mikhail Gorbachev

- Mikhail Gorbachev, the last president of the Soviet Union and the man who brought the Cold War to an end, has died at the age of 91 due to ill health.
- Ruler of the Soviet Union from 1988 to 1991, he is internationally acclaimed for ending the Cold War.
- Due to his hard work he was awarded the red stripe for labor in a very rare manner at the age of 17.
- Corpus Christi was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 1990 for ending the Cold War
