State news

1. 'The Red Balloon' short film in schools

- ❖ It has already been ordered that every second week of the month the screening of juvenile films in all government middle, high and higher secondary schools will be held for the students of classes six to nine in the course work allotted for them.
- ❖ On October 13th, the movie 'The Red Balloon' will be screened. This film is an Oscar-winning short film in French.

Central News

1. The next Chief Justice of the Supreme Court is TY Chandra Chute

- Current Chief Justice YU Lalit recommended the name of Senior Justice TY Chandra Chute to the Central Government for appointment as the next Chief Justice of the Supreme Court.
- Chief Justice U.U. Lalit gave a copy of this recommendation letter to Justice DY Chandra Chute, who is about to be sworn in as the fiftieth judge of the Supreme Court.
- ❖ The Chief Justice of the Supreme Court retires on the eighth.
- ❖ TY Chandra Chute, who will take over as Chief Justice on November 9, 2024, will hold the post for two years till November 10, 2024.
- ❖ The retirement age of Supreme Court judges is fixed at 65.
- On May 13, 2016, TY Chandra Chute was promoted as Supreme Court judge.
- Prior to that he was serving as Chief Justice of Allahabad High Court from 31st October 2013.
- ❖ He has also served as a Judge of Bombay High Court since March 29, 2000.
- ❖ In 1998, he became a senior advocate in Bombay High Court and was promoted to Additional Solicitor General in the same year.
- ❖ Justice DY Chandra Chute was the son of Justice Chandra Chute who served as the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court from 22 February 1978 to 11 July 1985.

2. India's economic growth estimate at 6.8 percent reduced by the IMF

- ❖ Last January, the IMF projected India's GDP growth at 8.2 per cent in the 2022-23 financial year.
- It was later reduced to 7.4 percent last January.
- ❖ India's economic growth estimate for the current fiscal has been cut to **6.8 percent** in the report released after the annual meeting of World Bank and IMF officials.
- This is 0.6 percent lower than last July forecast.
- ❖ India's economic growth in the financial year 2021-22 was 8.7 percent.
- ❖ Downgrade of Global Economic Growth Rating:



- ➤ Global economic growth will slow down from 6.0 percent in 2021 to 3.2 percent in 2022 and 2.7 percent in 2023, according to the IMF report.
- ➤ These projections reflect a significant slowdown in major economies (US, EU, China), the IMF said.
- Russia's invasion of Ukraine continues to affect the stability of the global economy.
- These challenges have arisen due to the impact of prolonged inflationary pressures and rising cost of living problems, the spread of Corona and the slowdown in China due to the series of shutdowns.
- According to the IMF report, China's economic growth is **3.2**% this year, which was **8.1**% in 2021.

3. Two swords and a shield for the Shinde team

- Shiv Sena coalition led by Uddhav Thackeray was in power in Maharashtra.
- Shiv Sena's **Eknath** was dissatisfied with the alliance and split in the party.
- ❖ 40 disaffected MLAs from Shiv Sena supported Eknath Shinde.
- ❖ Subsequently the government led by Uddhav Thackeray was overthrown.
- ❖ However, as the problem related to the name symbol of the party was not resolved, the Election Commission disabled them.
- Subsequently, the Election Commission assigned the name 'Shiv Sena Uddhav Bala Sahib Thackeray' and the symbol 'Eriyum Jyoti' to Uddhav Thackeray's team.
- ❖ At the same time, the Election Commission, which had named Shinde's team as 'Bala Sahebin Shiv Sena', assigned two swords and a shield symbol to the team.
- Shinde proudly said that this symbol is the symbol of Chhatrapati Shivaji and the old army.

4. 'Historic' deal with Lebanon: Israel

- ❖ Prime Minister Yair Labaid has announced a historic agreement with neighboring Lebanon to resolve the maritime border issue.
- ❖ Israel and Lebanon claim about **860 square kilometers** of the Mediterranean Sea.
- ❖ In this situation, after a long time of efforts by the United States, an agreement was formed between the two countries on this issue.
- Under the deal Israel would allow Lebanon to take offshore oil within the disputed territory.
